Itumeleng Kumalo - proud recipient of a B.Ed Degree

We would like to congratulate Itumeleng Kumalo, a 2020 Thuto Trust Teacher Development Programme intern and bursary recipient on achieving her Bachelor of Education Degree (Early Childhood Development) Foundation Phase from the University of South Africa (UNISA).

Itumeleng acquired an astounding 38 distinctions out of the 40 modules she registered for throughout her studies. What an achievement! She also received a belated (due to lock-down) award as a 'Top Performer' in her faculty for the 2019 academic year and attended the ceremony on Friday 4 December 2020.

This star student secured a full-time teaching position at Rivonia Primary School commencing in 2021.

During the period 2018-2020, Itumeleng received a three-year scholarship from Thuto Trust to study at UNISA, co-sponsored by Thuto partners (funders) Adcorp (2019) and Cambridge University Press (CUPSA) (2020). She completed her full-time internship at one of Thuto's partner schools, St Peter College.

This worthwhile financial Investment by Thuto Trust over the three-year period added up to R 353 129,69. The investment included the payment of her tuition, meals and living allowances, books, psycho-social support programmes, mentorships and COVID-19 relief funds.

"I am truly grateful for all Thuto Trust and sponsors' continuous support and generosity towards my well-being and learning. May you all be blessed and stay safe," says Itumeleng. We wish Itumeleng well with her future endeavours and will follow her career path closely.

2019/2020 PGCE students excel!

Five Thuto Trust final-year students of the 2019/2020 PGCE programme at the University of Johannesburg recently completed their postgraduate qualification. These five graduates are the first Thuto Trust candidates to complete the two-year internship and university programme.

We are celebrating new financial partnerships

Thuto Trust, GDE and DBE in tripartite partnership to upskill education degree students

The Department of Basic Education (DBE) and Gauteng Department of Education (GDE) has its own higher education, teacher bursary programme called the Funza Lushaka Bursary Programme. The bursary programme currently funds more than 150 students' tuition, transport, books and accommodation.

Thuto Trust, GDE and the DBE recently joined forces to offer 35 of the Funza Lushaka Bursary programme students access to Thuto Trusts' more comprehensive teacher development programme.

In addition to tuition, the full-time internship programme run at Thuto Trust partner schools, also offers academic tutoring, mentorship, leadership workshops and general psycho-social support.

The all-embracing value-add not only empowers students, but also equips them with teaching and leadership skills as well as developing their emotional intelligence. This enables them to start their teaching careers with confidence, ready to make a difference in school children's education, especially in subjects such as math and sciences.

Thuto Trust will be co-funding 20 of the 35 DBE, GDE students in 2021, and an additional 15 in 2022, offering the above-mentioned value-add in addition to the accommodation, tuition, books and transport already funded by the DBE.





A memorandum of agreement (MOA) was signed for a period of five years.

The interns will be placed at Thuto Trust partner schools selected by the GDE and the DBE.

The B. Ed students are studying at partner universities, University of South Africa (UNISA) and North West University (NWU), and the PGCE students at the Universities of Witwatersrand (Wits) and Johannesburg (UJ).

"We have been working on this MOA for more than 24 -months, and to finally reap the fruit of our long negotiations and many discussions with its signing, is momentous and significant for the growth of Thuto Trust."

"The co-funding tripartite MOA between DBE, GDE and Thuto Trust is a further step toward our goal to empower South Africa's public school system. The Thuto Trust teacher development programme is set apart from other teacher bursaries as a leading and growing brand, providing top interns and full-time employed teachers to public schools to change the face of education in South Africa", says Sello Kgosimore, Business Development Manager Thuto Trust.

Expanding our list of partner schools

Thuto is currently in the process of partnering with several new schools to expand its list of schools participating in the Thuto Teacher Development internship programme.

A new memorandum agreements (MOA) in final negotiation stages is with the Kyalami group of schools, giving Thuto access to Kyalami Preparatory School, Beaulieu Preparatory School and Beaulieu College.

The Kyalami Schools Group is made up of three distinguished schools in northern Johannesburg.
